# CELEBRATING NZTC'S BIGGEST INTERNATIONAL YEAR YET

2019 saw the NZTC team travel across the globe, achieve historic milestones and welcome more international students than ever before.

It has been a fulfilling year for New Zealand Tertiary College (NZTC), as the college expanded its international network and welcomed students from all over the world to begin their early childhood education studies in New Zealand.

The year started on a high with the college's work and influence in India acknowledged by the World Innovation Congress in Mumbai in February. The awards panel described NZTC Chief Executive Selena Fox as "a thought leader in the education sector and a contributor of value for our future generation".

In June, the team travelled to Fuzhou to celebrate five years of successful China partnerships, recognising the fourth cohort of graduates from the college's partnership with the Fujian Preschool Education College and the China Liberal Education Technology Development Company Limited.

A historic milestone was achieved in September, when NZTC India celebrated its tenth graduation ceremony in Mumbai. Established in 2009, NZTC India has supported over 250 local students to earn early childhood education qualifications throughout the country via online learning. As the college's international network continued to grow, the team travelled to China, Nepal, the Philippines, Malaysia, Korea and India throughout the year to meet face to face with educational partners and prospective students.

2019 saw NZTC welcome more international students than ever before, with 564 new students enrolled from Cambodia, China, Fiji, Germany, India, Korea, Malaysia, Myanmar, Nigeria, Peru, the Philippines, Portugal, the Solomon Islands, Sri Lanka, Taiwan, the United Kingdom, and Vietnam.

International Marketing Manager Audrey Wang said she was thrilled to see such a diverse group of students join the college to begin their early childhood education studies.

"There are so many great opportunities for early childhood teachers in New Zealand. It is a privilege to support our international community to learn more about *Te Whāriki* and our unique New Zealand approach to early childhood education," said Audrey.
